Thank you for the opportunity for the Canadian Society of Corporate Secretaries (CSCS) to contribute to the important work of the Expert Panel on Securities Regulation in Canada. We recognize the need for ongoing improvements to the securities regulatory regime in Canada and applaud the Panel in its efforts to engage key stakeholders. We also appreciate the principles-based approach being taken and the objectives those principles are intended to achieve given the special needs of the Canadian capital markets.

I believe CSCS's most valuable contribution could be two-fold. Firstly, we will ensure our members are aware of the timing and location of the Panel's meetings across Canada. Secondly, we would like to suggest that the Panel or its representatives consider interacting directly with a representative group of the CSCS members. Our members are ideally positioned to articulate the practical implications of current or anticipated regulations and to give guidance as the Panel prepares its recommendations. CSCS would be pleased to organize such a forum and invite you to contact me if you would like to pursue this opportunity further.
